


Is Money Tight? Cloth Diapers Can Help You Save!

Although the upfront cost may be higher, in the long run the cost of cloth diapers is significantly cheaper than that of disposables.



- * On average, from birth to 2.5 years of age a child will use approximately 6,000 diapers.
- * Depending on the brand you would spend between \$1,300 \$4,000.
- * If you did laundry every 2-3 days, you would need an average of 20-40 cloth diapers for the same period of time. The cost for these would be between \$150 \$800.

No matter how you look at it ... cloth diapers can help you save!

Reusable cloth baby diapers stop an estimated half-ton of disposable diapers per child from going into U.S. landfills each year and cuts down on pathogens that could leak into the water supply.

On average it takes girls 29 and boys 31 months to embrace the potty. A benefit to using cloth diapers is that your baby tends to potty train earlier. The reason is they can feel the wetness immediately, where disposables have that absorbent layer that wisks the wetness away. When a child gets uncomfortable, it helps them make the connection to using a potty sooner.

A common misperceptions about cloth diapers is that they are difficult to use and difficult to maintain. Not true - modern cloth diapers are actually just as easy to use as disposable diapers and are as easy to maintain as washing a load of laundry.
